- **It's making strange noises.** If you've lost a piece of silverware down the sink, you know it immediately when you turn on the disposal. The sound is horrifying! Other subtler sounds could be indicators of a problem. These include grinding, rattling, thumping, or if it's running louder than normal.
- **Clogs keep occurring, without apparent cause.** Sometimes your drain can back up and running the disposal clears it. If your drain is backing up and running the disposal doesn't clear it, or if it keeps backing up no matter how little you put in the disposal, it's a sign the unit could be malfunctioning, the blades need replacing, or you could need a larger one.
- **The power doesn't stay on.** If you experience intermittent power to your disposal, it's possible it's a blown circuit. If this isn't the case, it could be a failing motor. This is an indicator that an inspection by a plumber is a good idea.
- **There's a bad smell that won't go away.** Regular cleaning, correctly using and running the disposal, and only putting appropriate items down the drain should prevent odors. If you have a persistent and unpleasant smell coming from your disposal that you can't get rid of, you should call in a plumber. They can disassemble the appliance and remove whatever stinks.
- **It's not keeping up like it used to.** If your disposal's performance seems to be deteriorating over time, it could be from excessive use. It could also be because the unit is old, and wear and tear have taken its toll. A technician could fix it during a service call, but it might require replacement.
- **There's evidence of a leak under the sink.** Sometimes leaks can develop in the area where the disposal attaches to the plumbing under your sink. When this happens, it might not be noticeable at first. By the time you notice a nice puddle inside the cabinet, you might need to replace the whole unit. A professional plumber can evaluate the leak and determine if repair or replacement are necessary.
